1.1	What progress have you made on your Inclusive data priorities/ IDC Action Plan priorities in the past year?	Include examples to accompany any highlights or achievements.	 We commit to leaving no one behind by advocating for disability data: We have continued to advocate for the inclusion of disability data in the global indicator framework to ensure persons with disabilities are counted, measured, and not left behind again in sustainable development. We organized and supported partners in a session on disability data at the World Data Forum. We supported our OPD partner to present in the high-level session on leave no one behind data at the WDF. We organized an event on data equity and disability data with OPD partners hosted by the International Civil Society Centre. 	

 We are journeying as an organisation on the appropriate and effective use of disaggregated data to improve gaps in our programmes with respect to groups left furthest behind: As CBM Global is a start-up organisation, we are currently building our systems. We have a new online system for projects that has the potential to disaggregate data. Currently we are deciding on what type of data we will collect from our programmes and how to ensure that we take a consistent approach. We can give a further update on this in 2022 when all of our programmes come online. Our Humanitarian team will publish a paper on disability data in humanitarian response, which will help shape our future programmatic response. We align with the principle of the importance of community and citizen driven data, particularly in a humanitarian context. We support the International Civil Society Centre's Leave No One Behind (LNOB) Partnership that focuses on collecting community-driven data of the most marginalized groups to measure the SDGs as part of the working group on advocacy. We inputted into the GPSDD and LNOB Partnership report for
 We inputted into the GPSDD and LNOB Partnership report for the HLPF 2021 and supported our OPD partner to participate in the report and the event.
 We support advocacy initiatives that call for inclusive data that promotes transparency, but also recognise the need for protection and confidentiality: In 2020, we funded our OPD partner, the World Blind Union (WBU), to undertake research on the impact of COVID-19 among their members at the national level.

 In 2021, we funded national-level research to gather quantitative and qualitative data on COVID-19 one year on. We are part of UNICEF's Strategic Advisory Group of the Centre of Excellence on Data for Children with Disabilities. We recognise the need for strengthening our organisation's data skills and we recognise this is also critical for our partners. We continue to support persons with disabilities and their
 the SGPwD, Co-managing the open-source disability data listserv, Continuing to disseminate and share the disability data advocacy toolkit for organisations of persons with disabilities and translate into different languages and formats (Arabic – soon, English, French, Spanish, Easy Read, International Sign). We support inclusive data capacity building of organizations of persons with disabilities nationally, regionally, and globally, such as a training for NADD and a recent workshop for OPDs hosted by DPOD. We established an innovative partnership to build capacity in and increase the quality of disability data in the Asia-Pacific region with UNFPA, in close collaboration with the Stakeholder Group of Persons with Disabilities, the International Disability Alliance, and national and regional organizations of persons with disability Forum and ASEAN Disability Forum. This includes an interactive, eight-module training for OPDs.
